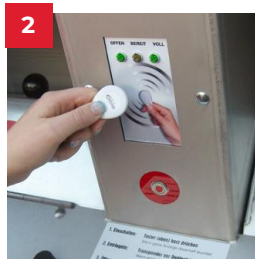


USO DEL CONTENEDOR DE RESIDUOS



If existent, please shortly press the button (red circle) to switch on the facility. If the display shows a yellow light the facility is ready to be used.



Hold your transponder (chip) in front of the transponder panel. Now the green display lights up and the shafts are unlocked.



You can now open one of both of the shafts and dispose your waste.



After closing of the shaft, the facility locks automatically.

You don't need to do anything else.



Tip:

You should use the smallest possible input shaft. So you will avoid costs which are not necessary.

Hinweis:

An identification by transponder is only possible at the shown transponder-areas.

The display-areas are only used to show the operation states.

Special operation states (red display)

5x red flashing:

Your transponder is not identified to access.

Permanent red flashing:

No waste container in the box (or service status).

Dauerhaft rotes Leuchten:

Waste container full up.



SAVING MONEY AND LOOKING AFTER THE ENVIRONMENT, MADE EASY:

- Do not place any waste near the refuse lock
- Do not place any residual waste in recyclables
- Fold up larger packaging
- Make use of reusable packaging
- Use a shopping basket instead of plastic bags
- Make larger boxes smaller

Why do we need a refuse lock?

Waste disposal will be allocated by apartment and therefore you will only pay for what you dispose of (a minimum quantity will apply).

When will my waste deposit be registered?

As soon as you have opened the deposit chute.

How much waste can I deposit?

The full capacity of the deposit chute will always be used, so you should take full advantage of the storage.

What should I do if my waste does not fit in the chute?

Our recommendation is to use bin bags that make the most of the dimensions of the chute. Bulky objects should be placed in bulky waste or reduced in size before being disposed of.

What happens if the waste container in the refuse lock is full?

A red continuous light will appear (after you have turned it on). Until the container is emptied, no more waste can be deposited.

I have lost my transponder?

Please contact your housing administration immediately, so that nobody is able to deposit any waste on your behalf.

I have no waste to deposit?

Every household has waste that must be disposed of as per local waste management.

WHY DO I NEED TO PAY THE COSTS FOR THE WASTE I PRODUCE?

Residual waste: It is expensive to dispose of residual waste and waste tax would be likely to increase.

Recyclables: It is free to dispose of plastic and metal packaging (e. g. drink bottles, yoghurt pots, tins ...), paper and glass. This is because the disposal costs for such products are already included in the sales price and therefore you already pay this!

Our aim: Save money!

How? Reducing the amount of residual waste by correctly separating our waste!



Please note: Dispose of all waste that is not collected in the containers for residual waste in the recyclables container that has been provided for this purpose (yellow/orange bins, yellow binbags, paper containers, glass containers, old clothes collection, etc...). **Please note the guidelines on how to separate your waste.**

Please note: If residual waste is wrongly put into the recyclables container, the whole container will be disposed of at the price of residual waste. That means unnecessary higher costs for everybody!
